**45** With extremely high ceilings, a strong sense of symmetry and gorgeous walnut panoptry, this living room in a 1940s Sydney home had great bones but needed to relax a little. Stewart Horton selected a palette of blues for the soft furnishings and installed a Carrara-marble fireplace. New brass chandeliers complement the original gilt mirror and a pretty rug anchors the space.
